THE NEW EDUCATION SOCIETY,
JABALPUR.**

TITLE AND OBJECT

1. The Society shall be denominated "THE NEW EDUCATION SOCIETY, JABALPUR."

OFFICE

2. The registered office of the Society shall be situated at Jabalpur in the "NAVIN VIDYA BHAWAN BUILDINGS."

AIMS AND OBJECTS

3. The aims and objects of the Society shall be-
 - (a) To promote the moral, social, physical and intellectual interests and well-being of the people by every legitimate means in its power.
 - (b) To represent the wants and the wishes of the public to the Government.
 - (c) To assist the Government as far as it can in the proper and salutary administration of the country and in all other matters tending to promote public good.
 - (d) To extend and promote literary, technical, and other useful knowledge amongst the people by starting or affiliating to itself in Jabalpur, or elsewhere in Madhya Pradesh educational institutions of all descriptions, particularly

providing for a Secondary High School or schools recognised by the Government and affiliated to the Secondary Education Board, Madhya Pradesh or the University as the case may be.

CONSTITUTION

4. The Society shall consist of the following :-
 - (a) Patrons.
 - (b) Donors.
 - (c) Life-members.
 - (d) Sympathisers.
 - (e) Ordinary members.
 - (f) Subscribers.
 - (g) Founder members.
 - (h) Representatives of institutions affiliated to the Society.
5. Patrons of the Society shall be persons who make a donation of Rs. 1,000/- or more, or make a gift of that value to the Society.
6. Donors of the Society shall be persons who make a donation of Rs. 500/- to the Society.
7. Life-members of the Society shall be persons who make a donation of Rs. 300/- to the Society.
8. Sympathisers of the Society shall be persons who make a donation of Rs. 100/-. Such persons shall continue to be the sympathisers for a period of five years only.
9. Ordinary members of the Society shall be persons who pay to the Society in lump sum the Annual fee of

Rs. 24/- (Twenty-four) only.

10. Subscribers of the Society shall be persons who pay to the Society the Annual fee of Rs. 3/- (Rs. Three) only.

11. An admission fee of Rs. 1/- per head shall also be charged from members of all categories.

PROVISIONAL COMMITTEE

12. The following persons shall constitute the Provisional Committee of the New Education Society and these persons shall be called the Founder-members of the Society and shall enjoy the rights and privileges here-in laid down :-

**Recognition & Enlistment of
Patrons, Donors, Life-members, Sympathisers,
Ordinary members and Subscribers.**

13. (a) The Managing Committee of the Society shall have power to recognise and enlist persons as Patrons, Donors, Life-members, Sympathisers, Ordinary members and Subscribers.
- (b) No person who has not attained the age of 18 years can be a member of the Society.
- (c) No person who is indebted to the Society shall be eligible for the membership of the Society.

ARREARS OF DUES

14. A member who is in arrears of subscription for three months after the date on which the Subscription falls due shall be liable to be removed from the membership, for which a written notice shall be given. He shall be eligible to resume membership on payment of arrears.

PRIVILEGES

15. Patrons, Donors, Life-members, Sympathisers, Ordinary members and Founder members shall be the members of the General Committee of the Society.

16. (a) Patrons, shall have the right to elect two representatives from amongst them to serve on the Managing Committee of the Society.
- (b) A Patron donating Rs. 25,000 /- or more shall be entitled to permanent membership of the Managing Committee.
- (c) A Lady Patron shall have the right to be represented by a nominee.

17. The Subscribers shall have right to elect one representative for every ten Subscribers to serve on the General Committee.

18. The Founder-members shall have right to elect five representatives to serve on the Managing Committee.

19. Shri K. L. Pande shall be the Founder Head Master of the NAVIN VIDYA BHAWAN and shall be the Secretary of the New Education Society.

20. The Founder Head Master shall not be removable from his post of the Founder Head Mastership before he attains the age of sixty years, except on ground of-

- (a) Gross misconduct; or
- (b) Permanent Physical or mental unfitness to be determined by a Medical Board constituted for the purpose by the Managing Committee of the Society.

The Managing Committee or the General Committee, as the case may be, as early as possible after the general elections are held.

28. All the above elected office-bearers and the members shall be elected every third year.

Provided that no person who has not been on the rolls of the Society for a period of six months immediately preceding the date of the elections shall be eligible to be elected as an office-bearer, as an elected representative or as a member of the Managing Committee,

Provided further that the life of the first Managing Committee constituted under these rules shall be of five years.

29. All money belonging to the Society shall be in deposit with the Treasurer of the Society.

DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE SECRETARY

30. It shall be the duty of the Secretary, or in his absence, or at his direction of the Joint-Secretary :-

- (a) To conduct the Correspondence of the Society.
- (b) To issue, under his signatures, notices convening meetings of various Committees functioning under the Society.
- (c) To record, or cause to be recorded the proceedings of all meetings of the Society.
- (d) To maintain, or cause to be maintained true and correct account of all moneys received and disbursement made supported by vouchers.
- (e) To prepare in consultation with the Heads of

the Institutions working under the Society a consolidated monthly bill of the salaries to be paid to the employees of the Society.

(f) To check at any time account of the income and the expenditure of the Institutions working under the Society and to report to the Managing Committee any matter which requires to be taken notice of by it.

(g) To appoint, suspend, dismiss and confirm employees of the Society drawing pay upto Rs. 50 per mensem.

31. The Secretary shall have power to sanction without reference to the Managing Committee any contingent expenditure not exceeding Rs. 200/- in any Department of the Society out of the Budget allotments.

The Secretary shall

32. exercise all such powers as may be necessary or expedient for carrying into effect the various orders and the decisions of the Managing Committee, or of the President.

PRESIDENT. HIS DUTY AND POWERS

33. The President shall preside at all meetings and regulate the proceedings thereof.

- (a) It shall be the President's duty to inspect and check the accounts of the Society as also of its various Institutions.
- (b) The President shall be the Executive Head of the Society and shall promote its general welfare.

34. The President shall have power to sanction without

reference to the Managing Committee expenditure upto Rs. 500/- out of the Budget allotments.

GENERAL COMMITTEE

35. The General Committee shall consist of :-

1. President.
2. Vice-Presidents.
3. Secretary.
4. Joint-Secretary.
5. Treasurer.
6. Patrons, Donors, Life-members, Sympathisers and Ordinary members of the Society.
7. The representatives of the Subscribers.
8. The Founder-members of the Society.
9. The Representatives of the affiliated institutions.

36. Every meeting of the General Committee shall be presided over by the President. No person who is an employee of the Society shall be elected as President.

37. In absence of the President, any of the Vice Presidents shall preside at the meeting.

38. In absence of the President and the Vice-Presidents the Committee shall elect its own Chairman out of the members present.

39. One-fourth of the number of the members of the General Committee or twenty-four members, whichever is less, shall form the quorum. No quorum shall be necessary

for an adjourned meeting.

40. Ordinary meeting of the General Committee shall be held yearly i.e. in the months of June and shall be mainly for the consideration of Annual Reports, the budgets, and the elections, whenever due.

41. A Special Meeting of the General Committee may be convened by the Secretary, or the President at any time either of their own motion, or on a requisition of at least five members of the General Committee of the Society submitted to either of them at least 15 days before the date on which the meeting is sought to be convened.

42. (a) For every Ordinary meeting of the General Committee 7 days' notice stating the place, the date and the hour of the meeting, shall be given to the members of the Society.

(b) For any special meeting of the General Committee, three days' notice setting forth the details mentioned in sub-clause (a) above shall be given to the members.

Provided that any of the afore-said notices shall be given to the members residing in Jabalpur by sending the same to them through the peon of the Society, and provided that the said notices shall in the case of non-resident members be sent by post to their addresses recorded in office.

Provided further that non-receipt of the notice shall not invalidate the meeting.

43. No subject which does not appear on the agenda

PROCEDURE AT THE MEETING OF THE MANAGING COMMITTEE

51. I. The President, or any of the Vice-Presidents in his absence, or in their absence any member of the Committee elected out of the members present shall preside at the meeting of the Managing Committee.
- II. No subject not on the agenda shall be taken up unless two-third of the members present agree to it.

FINANCE AND THE PROPERTY OF THE SOCIETY

52. The Finance and the property of the Society consists :-

- (a) The Funds belonging to the Society with the Treasurer, or deposited elsewhere.
- (b) The income received by collection of subscriptions.
- (c) Donations.
- (d) Income from fees.
- (e) Grant-in-aid or subsidy, if any, received from Government or any local body.
- (f) Money realised by sale, if any of any property belonging to the Society, or realised otherwise.
- (g) Buildings, lands, books, furniture, registers and office records belonging to the Society.
- (h) Income from other sources collected on behalf of Society.

53. The Society shall sue and be sued in the name

of the President who shall deal with the matter in suit either himself or appoint any member or members of the Managing Committee, or of the Society by a resolution passed in the meeting of the Managing Committee in this respect to act as Agent, or Agents on behalf of the Society for the purpose of any legal proceedings.

Provided that the President, or the Agent or Agents as aforesaid shall have no power to compromise without first obtaining consent of the Managing Committee.

54. No immovable property or investments shall be mortgaged or sold without the consent of the two-third members on the roll of the General Committee of the Society.

55. At least one per cent of the gross income of the Society or any of its departments should be credited into a Fund called the Reserve Fund of the Society, or of the Department.

The Society shall be the custodian of all these Funds.

AFFILIATION OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

56. The Non-Government Educational Institutions in Jabalpur, or elsewhere in Madhya Pradesh founded, or managed by private agencies may also get themselves affiliated to the New Education Society, Jabalpur, on their complying with the rules of affiliation to the Society here-in after provided.

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CONSTITUTION

57. The Constitution of the Society as embodied in these rules shall come into force on such date as may be



fixed by the Provisional Committee of the Society after they have been formally adopted by the said Committee, which shall not be later than one year after they are duly registered.

ALTERATION OF THE RULES

58. The Rules here in laid down may be modified by a special meeting of the General Committee convened for the purpose not earlier than three years from the date these rules come into force.

Provided that the rights of the Founder Members and the Founder Head-Master as herein laid down shall not in any way be curtailed or amended.
